
Foster Care Federal Fiscal Year 2015

Children are placed in foster care when a child protective services worker and court have determined it is not safe for them to remain home. Displacement from their family and disruption of their usual routine and familiar surroundings is traumatizing for many children. Children in foster care need strong relationships with caring adults, a network of social support, and services to cope with the challenging circumstances of home removal. Children who are older, are a racial or ethnic minority, have special needs, or suffer from a behavioral or mental disorder are more likely to experience multiple foster care placements and stay in care longer. Young people who "age out" of foster care (instead of returning home or being adopted) may face challenges to making a successful transition to adulthood.

⁷ For children entering care in FY 2015. "Other" includes drug or alcohol abuse by the child, child's disability, relinquishment, and parental death. ⁸ APPLA stands for Another Planned Permanent Living Arrangement.

⁹ The number of places the child has lived, including the current setting (except for trial home visits), during the current removal episode.

¹⁰ Other placement types include pre-adoptive home, runaway, supervised independent living, and trial home visit.

¹¹ Emancipation means the child/youth legally reached majority (i.e., is considered an adult) due to age, marriage, etc.

¹² Includes children aged 9 and over with a case goal of long term foster care or emancipation.



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
