BINGE DRINKING


Definition: Adult males who consume five or more drinks on one occasion, or adult females who consume four or more drinks on one occasion.1

In 2010, the prevalence of binge drinking among men was twice that of women, in Hawaii and the United States. Binge drinkers were 14 times more likely to report alcoholimpaired driving than non-binge drinkers.¹

Nationally, in 2010, the prevalence and intensity of binge drinking was highest among persons age 18-34 years, but the frequency of binge drinking was highest among binge drinkers aged ≥65 years.²

According to the federal government's annual traffic safety assessment Hawaii ranked number one in the nation for alcohol-related fatalities.³

44% of all fatal crashes in Hawaii in 2011 involved a driver with a BAC level ≥ 0.08 . The national average was 31%.³

In 2011, 4,034 adults were arrested for DUI in the state of Hawaii.⁶
